HISTORY

IQRA College is an Islamic school serving students from Reception to Year 12, located at 5 Majors Road, O'Halloran Hill SA 5158.

Established in 2017 as an independent institution, IQRA College's primary objective is to nurture a generation of educated, respectful, and impactful Muslim citizens dedicated to advancing societal well-being and development.

Initially launched with 39 students enrolled from Reception to Year 7 and a faculty of 5 educators, our school's foundation was strengthened by the support of Allah SWT and community volunteers. Over the years, IQRA College has experienced significant growth, with enrolment reaching 438 students in the 2023 academic year. Our expansion has been remarkable, progressing from serving Reception to Year 6 in 2017, through to Year 12 in 2020. Notably, our student body represents over 30 different nationalities.

From our humble beginnings with 17 staff members, including 9 qualified teachers, IQRA College has expanded its team to 60 dedicated professionals, including 37 qualified educators, by 2022.

Alhamdulillah, we are proud of our journey and remain committed to fostering academic excellence and moral development within our diverse community.



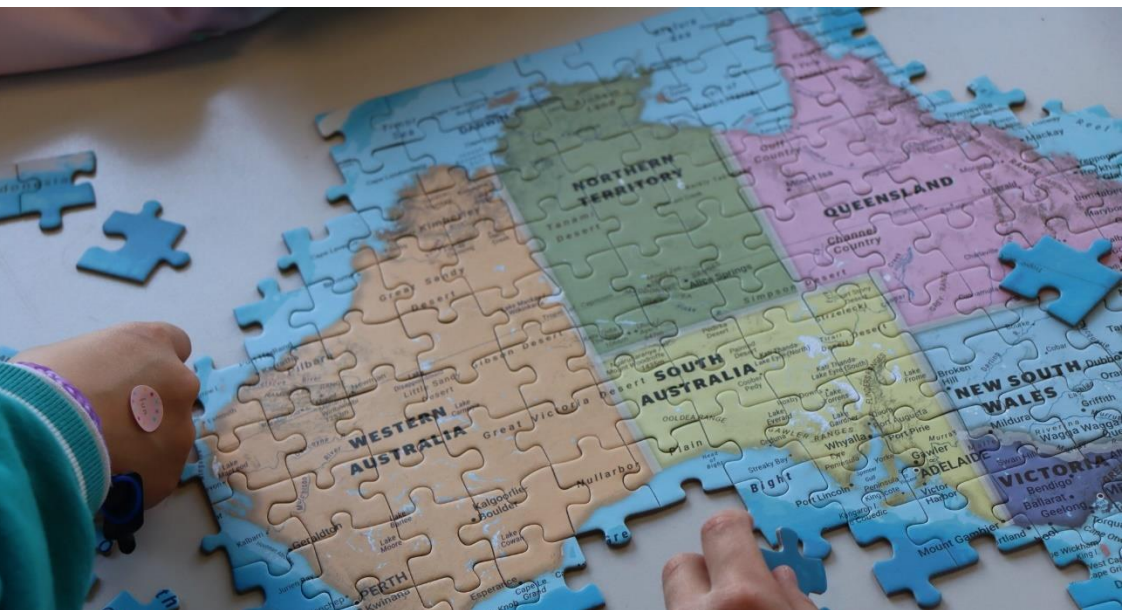
IQRA COLLEGE TODAY

WHOLE SCHOOL APPROACH

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FRAMEWORK

IQRA College works hand in hand with the school staff to develop positive, safe, supportive learning cultures. The Positive Behaviour Policy is designed to improve social, emotional, behavioural, and academic outcomes for our students.

Through the active implementation of the policy in 2022, the College observed a significant shift in focus among teachers and students. More time is devoted to cultivating positive teacher-student relationships and meaningful classroom instruction, Alhamdulillah.

STUDENT WELLBEING

The Student Wellbeing Day introduced in 2022 was enthusiastically embraced by both students and staff. Held each term, this event features engaging games and activities both in the classroom and outdoors, fostering a sense of inclusivity and strengthening bonds within our school community. Students eagerly anticipate these days as opportunities to actively participate in enjoyable activities alongside friends and teachers.



IMAGE OF IQRA CHILD

The apparent responsibility that Islam cares about and urges is the responsibility on the part of the teachers to educate, instruct, and teach. It starts in the child's very early years and continues through the stages of discretion and adolescence until the child becomes fully mature. During these sensitive stages, IQRA College aims to provide a secure and conducive environment that responds to the holistic development of the child. A parent survey was conducted to gauge parents' satisfaction and aspirations they have for their child.

Understanding the need for a holistic education, IQRA College sees the child as deserving the rights to be developed in the following literacies:

Faith Literacy	Linking the child, from when he/she starts to realise the principles of faith, and educating him the pillars of Islam, and the foundations of the Islamic guidelines.
Moral Literacy	The set of ethical principles and moral values that have to be inculcated in the child, foundation of a brilliant youth in society.
Physical Literacy	Healthy and sound in body through following the precepts for healthy food, drink and sleep, diligence and keeping away from laxity and dissoluteness, respecting and protecting one's own body, etc.
Intellectual Literacy	Mental upbringing according to the concepts of Islam, together with elements of modern scientific knowledge: Education, Intellectual Enlightenment and Mental Health.
Cultural Literacy	Training from an early age to be bold, frank, having the capacity for goodness to others, the be self-disciplined when angry and of sound moral behaviour.
Social Literacy	4 essential elements in social literacy are: 1. Psychological principles, 2. Taking into consideration the rights of others, 3. Adhering to the general social morals, 4. Supervision and social criticism.
Interpersonal Literacy	Becoming a responsible adult and understands life, know what is lawful and what is unlawful, being cautious and not driven by desire nor led to immorality.

LEARNING AND WELLBEING

IQRA College involves the whole school community in developing a culture of learning and positive wellbeing as we see the greatest benefits in students and staff.

Experiential learning often occurs in and out of the classroom walls and involves students in activities that stimulate their senses. It is one of the many methods teachers in IQRA College use to implement knowledge, learning, and/or skills. Students are made to do guided experiments with practical applications, involve students in simulated real-life scenarios through presentations, interactions, and experiential exercises that make the learning experience more interesting and fun, including teaching our students new (or old) skills or helping them remember and use information effectively.



ACADEMIC IMPROVEMENT AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The College puts the Literacy and Numeracy program with rigour. Pioneers, Prosperers, and Vanguarders programs are supporting students who are working at different achievement levels in both Literacy and Numeracy.

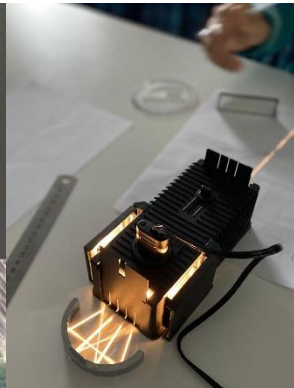

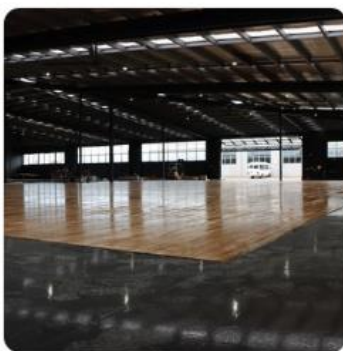
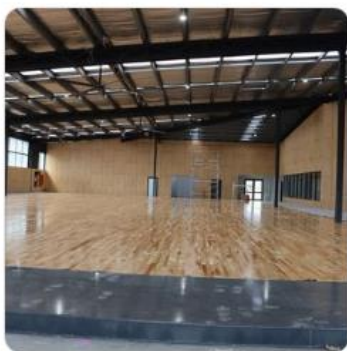
EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

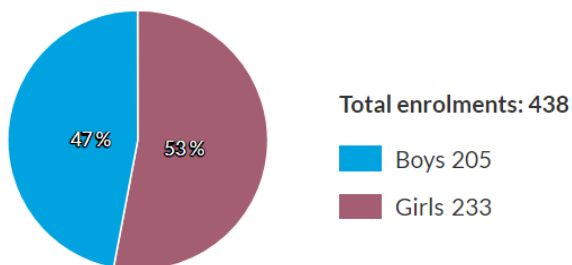


The primary years students are welcomed into their new classrooms with glass walls, where they remain focused on their studies.

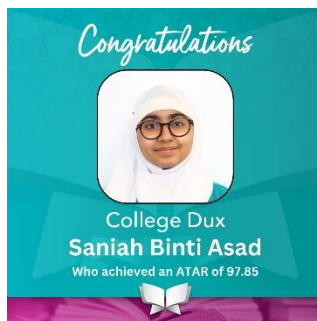
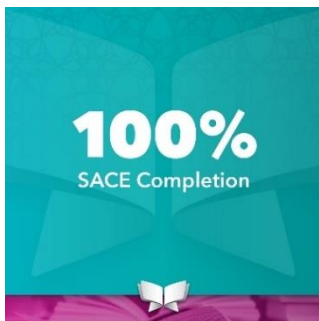

Areas of their studies include optometry, aviation, law, psychology, oral health, engineering, and computer science.

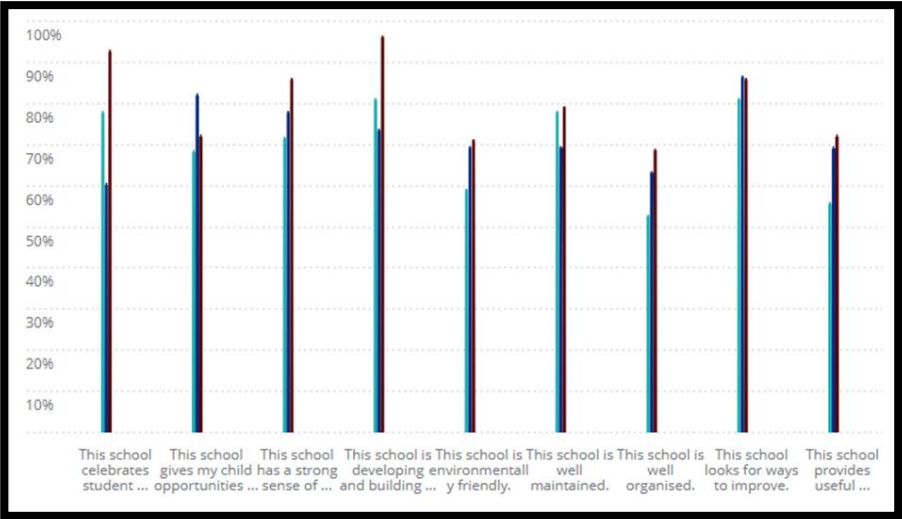

The top performing secondary school was IQRA College, in O'Halloran Hill, where the average result was 597.4.

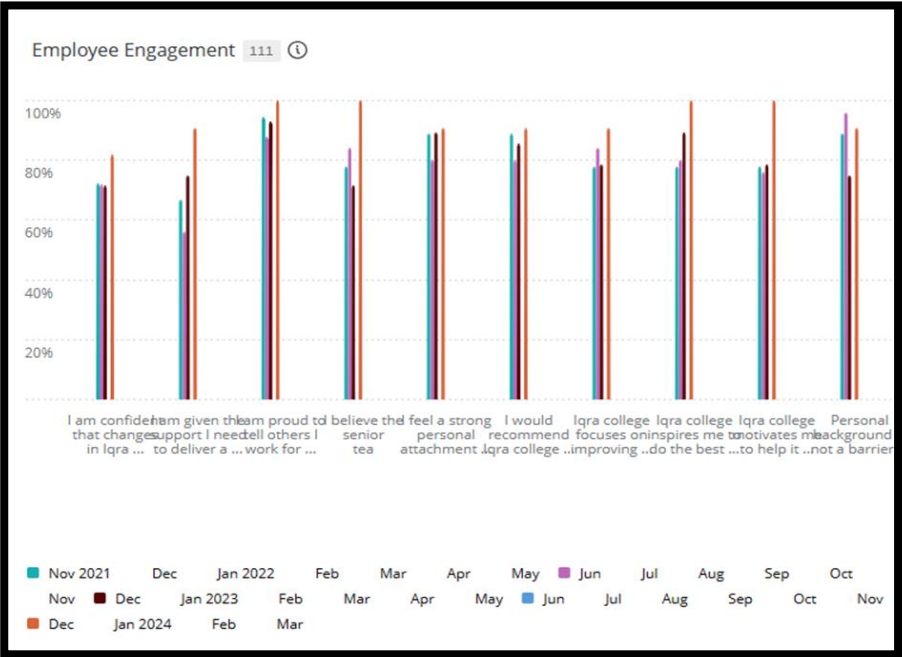
Willunga Waldorf School in was the second best for the region with an average score of 587.0, while Woodcroft College in Morphett Vale was the third best with an average score of 574.8.

Parents Engagement – School Performance

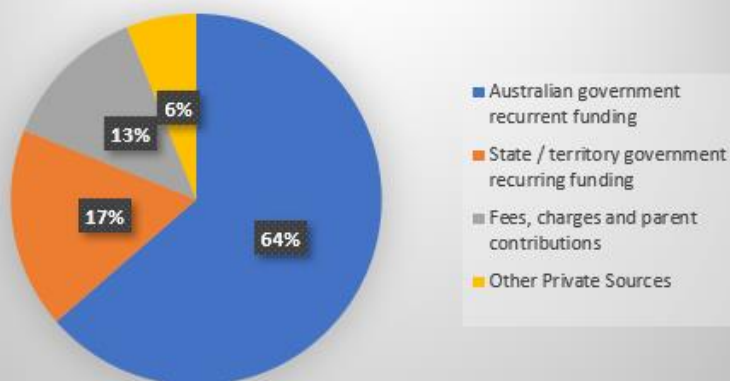


Employee Engagement
