HISTORY

IQRA College is an Islamic College from Reception to Year 12 situated on 5 Majors Road, O'Halloran Hill SA 5158.

Established in 2017 as an independent school, thanks to God, the fundamental aim for IQRA College is to establish a generation of educated, respectful and beneficial Muslim citizens who will contribute to the well-being, protection and development of society and mankind.

Begun with a total enrolment of 39 students at Reception to Year 7 and 5 teaching staff, there were no other staff on Day One other than community volunteers and Allah SWT built us from there. Alhamdulillah, IQRA College has now grown to 356 in the schooling year of 2021. The school grew from a R – Year 6 in 2017, R – Year 10 in 2018, R – Year 11 in 2019 and eventually R – Year 12 in 2020. Our students were made up of 30 nationalities.

Started with 17 total staff members including 9 qualified teaching staff, IQRA College in 2021 had a total of 32 staff members including 23 qualified teaching staff, Alhamdulillah.


PROJECT ZERO, HARVARD THINKING ROUTINES

The school focus is to create a supportive and engaging curriculum whereby students are encouraged to think beyond their comfort zone. This ties in with the College's fundamental aim and one of the many ways to achieve this is creating classrooms to become a place where our learners today become

the citizens of leader tomorrow.

Through continuous reflection, observation, and discussion with the staff on quality teaching and learning including student surveys to identify student interest and needs, the College started embedding the Harvard Project Zero Thinking Routines through focused clusters.

The whole school teaching staff were engaged in analytical discussion to observe the visible improvement in the ways student thinks within the focused clusters. The end year outcome recorded more engaged classrooms and resulted in the continuation of this effort as a whole school approach for the subsequent year.








IMAGE OF IQRA CHILD

CLUBS

The school club program was initiated in 2020. It was done within curriculum hours to give each student the opportunity to be in an interest club. The program received immediate interest and support from students and families. Students explored their interests, and many discovered the clubs that interests them.

In 2021, the College run sports clubs with minimum academic requirement which adds a competitive edge in students.



VANGUARDS, PROSPERS AND PIONEERS

In 2021, the College placed greater focus on literacy and numeracy. Students' progress and achievements were observed and learning gaps analysed, to develop learning access to both emerging and advanced students. Consequentially, the College developed an access program which included 3 focused learning tiers; Pioneers, Prospers and Vanguards. The focused learning tiers will be implemented in 2022 in English and Mathematics classes.









As a young school, IQRA College strives to provide a sound education based on its Islamic ethos and practices. The School's Strategic Plan 2020–2021 was designed with the aim to improve teaching and learning which focuses on the strategic pillars of learning, academic improvement and learning facilities. - Provide learning support to students especially in SACE subjects




SCHOOL FACILITIES




STUDENT ENROLMENT

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION & TRAINING


1 student undertook a Certificate 1 in Construction, and 1 student undertook a Certificate 3 in Fitness.


IQRA College is pleased to know that our graduates embarked into their tertiary education in various fields through local universities; Flinders, Adelaide and UNISA.


